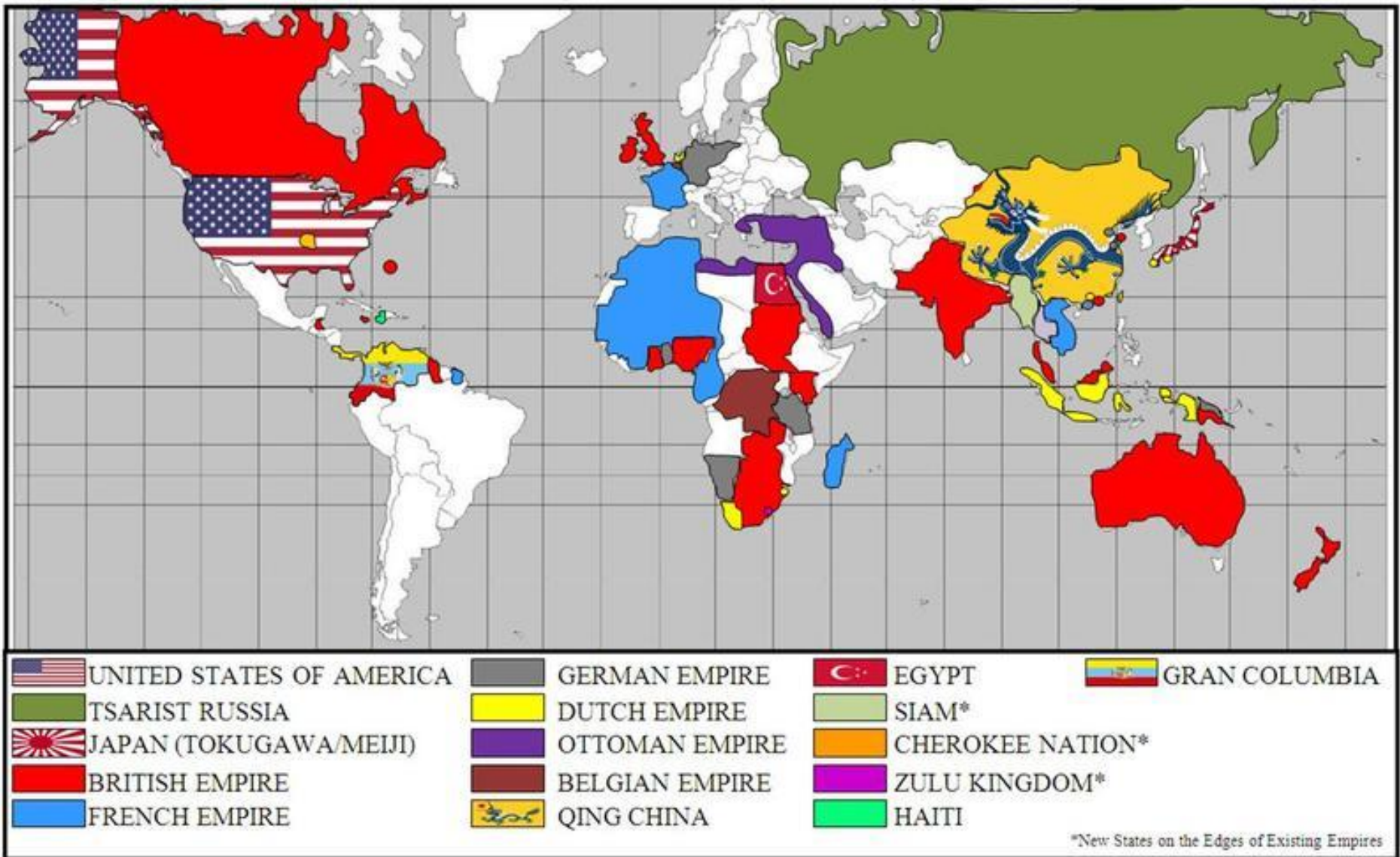

HISTORICAL CONTEXT OF PERIOD 5 GEOGRAPHY: THE MAP OF THE FIRST GLOBAL CIVILIZATION

Between 1750 and 1900, the world's geography was defined by technology and colonialism. Technologies of transportation and communication, trade, venture capital, and migration created the world's first global civilization and fueled the competition for and acquisition of empires. Centers of industry such as the vast Canadian-American complex around the Great Lakes and the Ruhr of Germany became critical. To facilitate trade and military power, canals were dug between seas and oceans.
