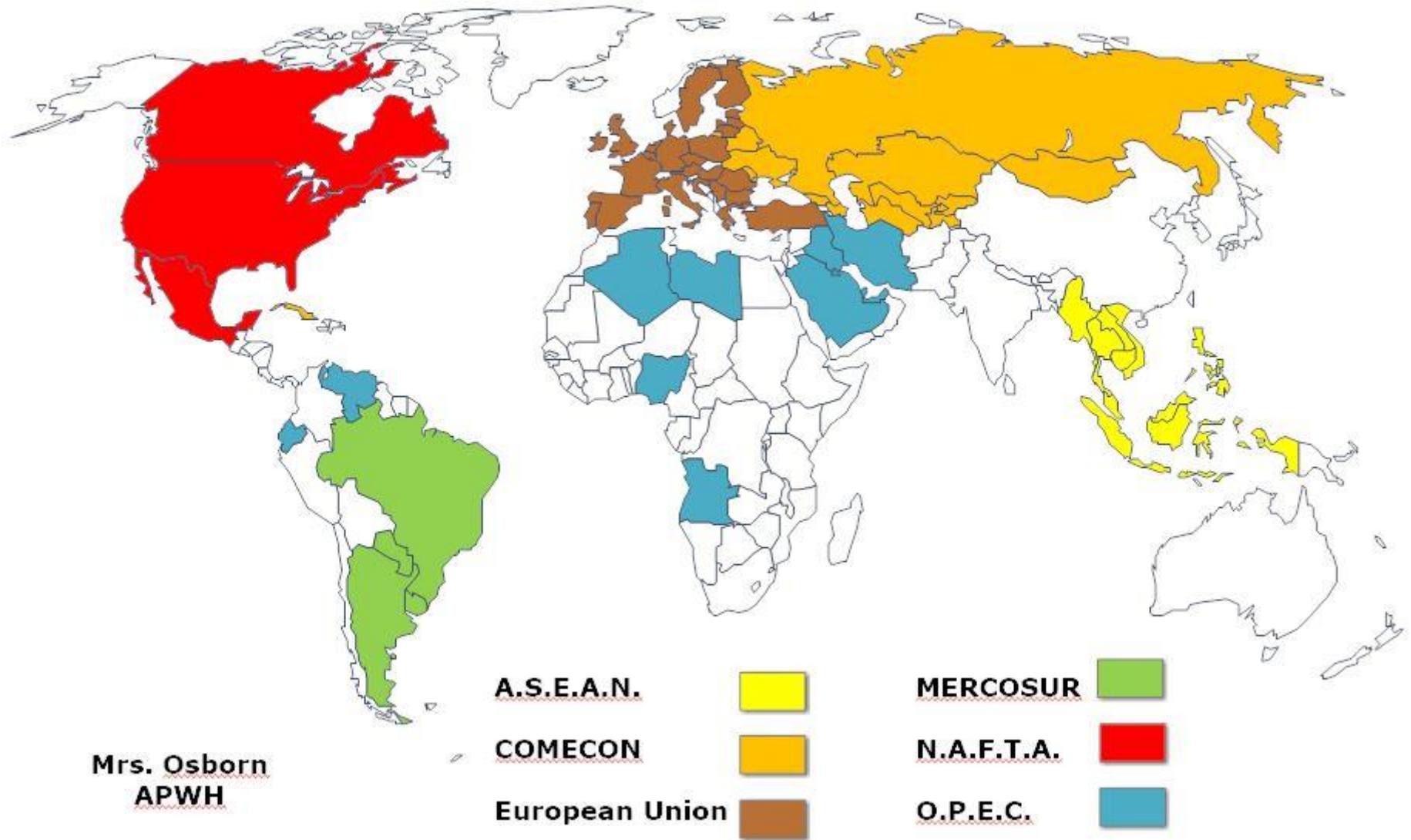

PERIOD VI GEOGRAPHY: THE MAP OF THE CONTEMPORARY WORLD
